

## AIRPORT SECURITY DIRECTOR

The Town of Islip is seeking an experienced Airport Security Director for the Department of Aviation & Transportation. This employee will coordinate and supervise the operation of the security force for the Long Island MacArthur Airport.

## **TYPICAL DUTIES**

- Oversees the daily operation and administrative functions of the airport security division;
- Directs airport security and law enforcement functions;
- Provides detailed security reports to the Town Commissioner and Deputy Town Commissioner;
- Manages the assignment of security personnel;
- Coordinates training of personnel in airport security operations;
- Plans and implements security and law enforcement policies and procedures;
- · Maintains contact with local, state and federal law enforcement agencies;
- Investigates complaints regarding activities of the airport security division;
- Participates in airport emergency programs in conjunction with aircraft fire rescue operations;
- Acts as the Incident Commander for all security related emergencies;
- Maintains various records regarding the security operation of the airport.

## NECESSARY SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS

- There will be a qualifying psychological evaluation for open-competitive candidates.
- Candidate must be at least 21 years of age.
- At the time of appointment and during employment in this title, employee must possess a valid license to operate a motor vehicle in New York State.
- Candidate must be a United States Citizen at the time of appointment.
- At the time of appointment to a position designated in Section 2.10 of NYS Criminal Procedure Law as having peace officer status, open-competitive candidates will be required to possess a valid Suffolk County Pistol Permit. Employees must maintain the permit throughout employment in this title.
- Open-competitive candidates will be required to successfully complete a CPR/AED Course given by the American Heart Association (AHA) or equivalent health care provider during the first year employment. Employees in this title must maintain this certification throughout employment.
- After open-competitive appointment, persons designated as peace officers in Section 2.10 of New York State
  Criminal Procedure Law will be required to obtain a Peace Officer Training Certificate recognized by the New
  York State Municipal Police Training Council.

Minimum Qualifications: Graduation from a college with federally-authorized accreditation or registration by NYS with a Bachelor's Degree, and ten (10) years of law enforcement experience from an accredited law enforcement agency, two (2) of which must be in a supervisory position relating to airport law enforcement such as: airport operations, aviation, emergency services, airport bomb squad or airport related experience
