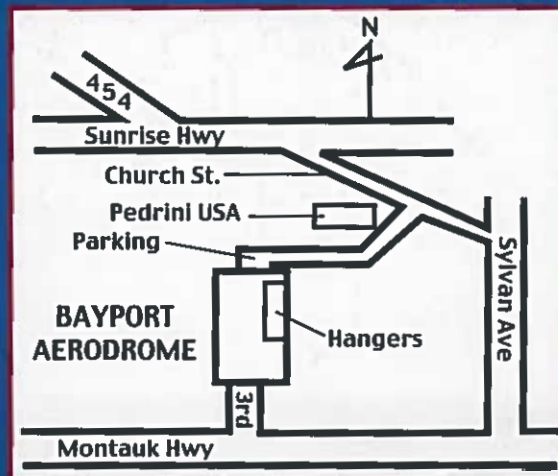

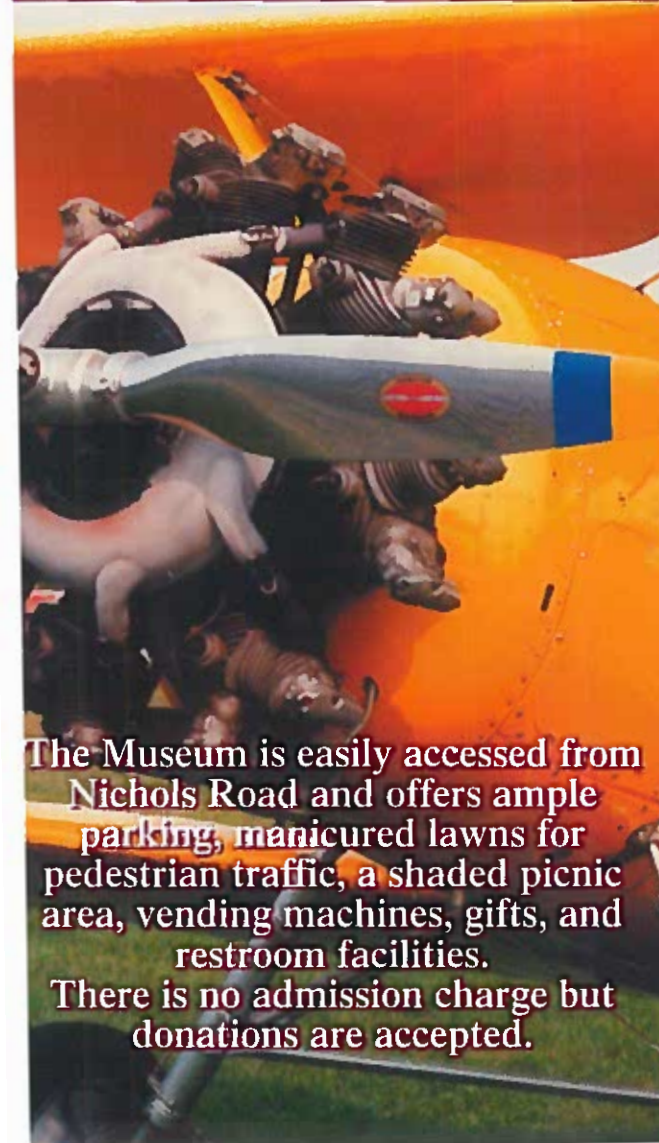

area, vending machines, gifts, and  
restroom facilities.  
There is no admission charge but  
donations are accepted.





The Bayport Aerodrome Museum is administered by the Bayport Aerodrome Society (BAS), a non-profit organization dedicated to the preservation and heritage of Long Island aviation. Located in the historic hamlet of Bayport, NY and operating from the last grass public airport on Long Island, the BAS has meticulously cared for the 1928 airfield since 1978.

With over 120 active members our "Living Museum" houses 24 hangers and boasts an impressive collection of over 40 pristine and airworthy antique, experimental, and classic aircraft from Aviation's Golden Age.



On occasion, a lucky visitor will experience the thrill of a lifetime as they become a passenger in one of our antique biplanes, flying over Fire Island and the Great South Bay. Our grounds are also open to appointed private tours, parties and events.

Open every Saturday and Sunday from April to October, the Museum's aircraft are wheeled out before their hangars for public display.



Our seasoned pilots and veterans give educational tours commencing at our main display hangar which consists of a static display 1911 Bleriot, a Great War SE5 fighter, a parachute equipped 1946 Stinson 108, and other memorabilia. Tours are conducted from 10am to 4pm.
